This week in World History, students:

- Finished their essays on their assigned world religions by answering the following questions:
 - What is the background and founding of this religion?
 - When and where is this religion set in history
 - How did it come to be?
 - What are the fundamental beliefs and practices of this religion?
 - Major tenets (beliefs) of religion
 - Major god(s)
 - Ceremonies
 - Process and place of worship
 - Prayers/holy book
 - Who are the important people in this religion?
 - Founder
 - Major spiritual leaders
 - How has this religion evolved over time?
 - Ancient geographic distribution
 - Modern geographic distribution
 - Changes that have occurred over time in the religion
- After finishing their research, students wrote rough drafts and peer edited each others' work
- Reviewed for the Final Exam by answering their study review packet
- Took their Final Exam

English

Since we have not sent out Friday letters in a while. Here is an update of what we have been doing the last couple of weeks in English:

- Students have been working on their personal essay drafts. We have discussed boxes and bullets and students have set up their thesis and supports so it is clear and easy to read in that format. They have also created an organizer for their drafts and mini-stories to go along with their "supports."
- Students have been frequently meeting in book clubs and discussing their current "Indian" themed texts.
